TORNADO SIREN INSTALLED

The Weather Siren installation is complete. Testing is the first Wednesday of each month sometime between 11 and noon for approximately 30 seconds, provided it is not stormy weather.

Gathering points suggested are the closest bathhouse and then the basement of the Country Store. You need to stay away from windows. If caught outside, get on ground at lowest point possible such as a ditch.

Be prepared and make sure everyone in your household knows what to do in an emergency. Being prepared could save your life.

BE PREPARED:

1. Get a Kit of emergency supplies
 - Water – one gallon per person per day for drinking and sanitation
 - Non-perishable Food – at least a 3 day supply
 - Battery powered or hand crank Radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with Alert tone and Extra Batteries for both
 - Flashlight and Extra Batteries
 - First Aid Kit
 - Whistle to signal for Help
 - Filter mask or cotton t-shirt, to help filter the air
 - Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for person sanitation
 - Wrench or Pliers to turn off utilities
 - Manual can opener if kit contains canned food
 - Plastic sheeting and duct tape to keep shelter in place
 - Important family documents
 - Items for unique family needs such as daily prescription medications, Infant formula or diapers
2. Make a plan for what to do
 - Have a plan on how to contact each other
 - Have coins or a prepaid phone card
 - Do you stay or get away – depends on emergency – plan alternate routes
 - Watch television and listen to the radio for official instructions as they become available.
 - Create a plan to shelter in place and a plan to get away.

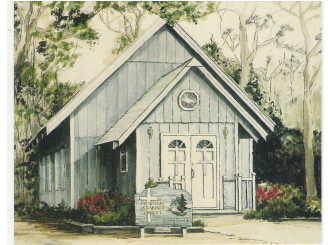

Down the Drain Tips

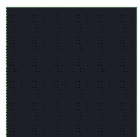
- **Install a backflow valve in your sewer line.**
- Only flush biodegradable items.
- Use single ply (not Charmin) or RV toilet paper.
- Use garbage can for other toilet paper usage.
- Do not flush cigarette butts.
- Do not leave water running when not occupied.
- Use phosphorus free detergents.

NEW PERMIT FROM EPA

Mountain Lakes Water and Sewer Authority has received the permit from the EPA to increase the discharge amount. Project is starting this month to complete installation of the mechanical system purchased in the spring and should be completed by the end of the year.
